

## THE TKF STORY

In January 1995, Tariq Khamisa, a 20-year-old SDSU student, was killed by Tony Hicks, a 14-year-old gang member. Tony was tried as an adult and sentenced to 25 years in prison. Tariq's father, Azim Khamisa, felt this tragedy created "victims on both ends of the gun." Azim reached out to Tony's grandfather, Ples Felix, in an act of extraordinary grace and forgiveness. The two came together in the spirit of healing to end youth violence. This collaboration founded the Tariq Khamisa Foundation (TKF) in October 1995.


## TKF SERVICES 1995-2017

- 127,333 students have attended Peacemaker Assemblies
- 9,224 young people have participated in TKF facilitated educational curriculum
- 2,360 youth have received individualized mentoring services from TKF
- 550,000 San Diego Children have attended TKF presentations or workshops
- The TKF story has reached more than 2 million individuals through public broadcasting series, educational networks, conferences, published articles, news stories, and other media outlets.

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## SAFE SCHOOL EXPANSION PLAN

The mission of the Tariq Khamisa Foundation (TKF) is to create safer schools and communities through educating and inspiring children in the restorative principles of accountability, compassion, forgiveness, and peacemaking.

TKF, over its 23 year history, has successfully created the Safe School model, which has been evaluated by 3rd parties like Cal State San Marcos and San Diego State University.

The Safe School program inspires youth toward improved social/emotional health, sound decision-making, collaboration and peaceful conflict resolution. Currently, TKF's instruction and services impact over 12,000 children annually in San Diego.

**TKF is expanding its programs. These programs, for grades 5-9, include:**

### Peacemaker Assembly:

The TKF Peacemaker Assembly is a powerful, interactive school presentation that tells the real-life TKF story about the consequences of violence.

### Restorative Curriculum:

The TKF Restorative Workshop is a ten-session peace education curriculum with lessons focused in social-emotional development and restorative practice methods.

### Educator Trainings:

2-3 Day training delivered by TKF to educators in restorative practice programming.



## WHY TKF'S SAFE SCHOOL MODEL?

- TKF primarily focuses restorative programming for children ages 10 to 18. It's significant to note, that Tony Hicks joined a gang at 11 and killed Tariq Khamisa at 14.
- TKF's program growth has been sustainable for 23 years. The "Forgiveness Story" provides the model and validation to the concepts we are teaching and is built on truth.
- Instructional materials developed to meet educational standards for social competency, healthy decision making, and personal safety.
- Impacts kids and teachers with early intervention.

## THE FACTS:

- The National incarceration cost for 1 person is \$148,000
- Students' ages 12-18 are victims of 1.9 million crimes at school
- From 1972-2012 out-of-school suspension rates increased by 300% and youth incarceration rates rose by 400%
- A youth suspended at school is 5x more likely to commit a crime
- 60% of youth (all demographics) will experience some type of trauma

## EXPANSION GOAL:

TKF has raised \$100,000 from grants and donors to initiate the expansion plan. There is an additional \$500,000 needed to complete development and testing (2 yrs) and be able to expand nationally within 5 years.

## THE EXPANSION PLAN:

TKF currently serves over 30 sites in San Diego and has expanded to pilot the Safe School Model in Pennsylvania.
